FLUSHING MEADOW, Saturday. — The plan for the partition of Palestine into separate Jewish and Arab States was at 5.30 (New York time) this afternoon adopted by the General Assembly of the United Nations by 33 votes to 13, with 10 abstentions and one delegation absent. The voting came after a last ditch effort by the Arab States to prevent partition by proposing the establishment of a federated state based on the canton system, in which the Jews and Arabs would be separated as far as possible.

The Arab motion, which was attacked as a move to sabotage the U.N. Partition plan, was opposed by Haifa and even the usually the rapporteur of the Ad Hoc Committee, Mr. Thors, and by the delegate of the United States, Mr. H. Johnson, who asked the Chairman, Dr. Aranha, to call for a vote on the Ad Hoc Committee's recommendation for Partition. Dr. Aranha ruled that the delegates would have to vote on the partition plan after hearing last minute appeals by Iran and Syria. Mr. Johnson, said: There is nothing conciliatory in this," and he was supported by the Soviet Delegate.
